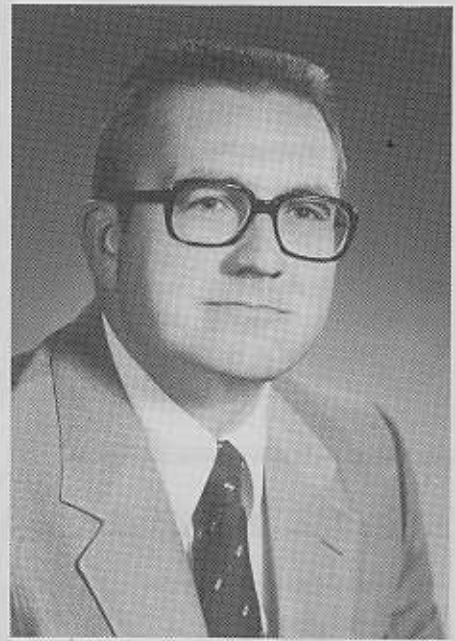

William E. Hammer, Jr.

William E. Hammer, Jr. is currently serving as Vice President and as a member of the Board of Governors of the Engineers Club. Bill has been a member of the Club since 1978. As Director of Information Systems for the Duriron Company, Inc., Bill is responsible for planning, organizing and controlling information systems and data processing ac-

He joined Duriron in 1967 as Senior Industrial Engineer and was Manager of Systems before being promoted to his current position. (now at AT&T Technologies) in Columbus, where he spent five years in manufacturing and quality control.

He has served on University of Dayton alumni and advisory committees and is a member of the Industrial and Systems Engineering Alumni Advisory Committee at Ohio State. He has taught courses in quantitative methods and manufacturing organization and management at the University of Dayton. He is an Industrial Engineering Visitor for the Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology (ABET). He is Chairman of the Computer and Information Systems Subcommittee of the Standards Committee on Industrial Engineering Terminology (ANSI Z94).
