

Frederic L. Rieger, 1920-2004

A longtime member, Mr. Rieger, 84, died June 29 at his Spring Valley home. The 1937 graduate of Oakwood High School attended the University of Dayton and Miami-Jacobs College. Before rising to become president of engineering at Monarch Marking Systems, where he held several patents in labeling and marking technology, he

produced sportsman films for TV in the 1950s and '60s.

Mr. Rieger enjoyed restoring pipe organs and antique cars and protecting natural areas. He lived a life of creative achievement and shared his enthusiasm. His daughter, Anne Corwynn, lives in Spring Valley Twp., and his son, Rick, resides in Columbus.

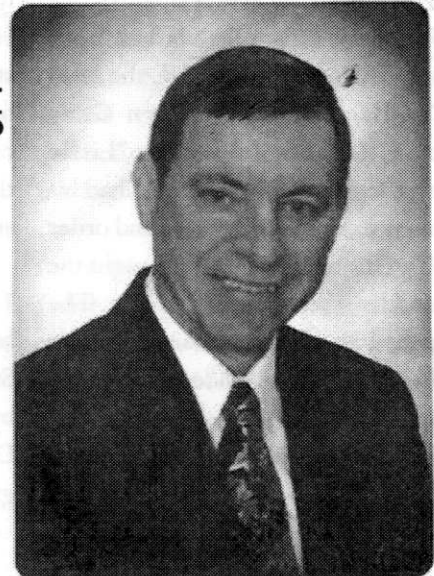
