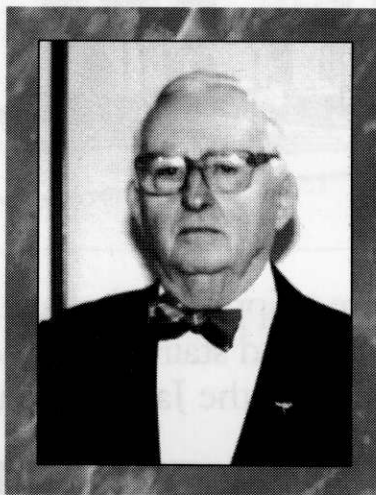
John Sullivan Jr.

John Sullivan Jr. was born in Cincinnati, Ohio, on August 12, 1912. He attended Walnut Hills High School there, and College Preparatory College in Shaker Heights, Ohio, in 1931. He received his bachelor of architecture degree in 1936 from Cornell University in New York, and his master's degree in architecture from Massachusetts Institute of Technology in Cambridge, Massachusetts, in 1938. 1505

Sullivan practiced architecture in Cincinnati, Indianapolis and Dayton. He established the firm of Yount & Sullivan, which later became known as Sullivan, Lecklider & Jay. He retired from practice in June of 1975.

Among his major architectural projects were the Dayton International Airport, Kettering Memorial Medical Center, Cox Heart Institute, and three of Wright State University's buildings. His projects also included a number of school buildings, as well as several buildings for General Motors.

Mr. Sullivan was very active in community activities, including Presidents of Montgomery County Historical Society, Dayton Art Institute,

the Muse Machine—a young people's performing arts group, and the Dayton Chapter of the American Institute of Architects. He was 1978 chairman of the Ohio Foundation Conference, and a 37-year member and chairman of the Patterson Homestead Commission. He was director of the Dayton Foundation for nine years, and of Grandview Hospital for three years. He also served on the City of Dayton Architectural Review Committee.

He was a member of the following area organizations: Tau Beta Pi, American Institute of Architects, Cincinnati Country Club, Miami Hunt & Polo Club, Dayton Racquet Club, The University Club, and the Buzz Fuzz Club. But, best of all, he has been a member of the Dayton Engineers Club since 1945, and is currently active in the Club's Barn Gang.

His wife, Frances, passed away in 1982. He has two daughters—Frances Reppenger and Stephanie Hunter.
