Richard Kirby Flitcraft II was born in 1920 at Woodstown, NJ. He married Bertha Hitchner and received his BS Degree from Rutgers University in 1942. His MS degree in Chemistry was earned from George Washington University in St. Louis in 1948. He has four children; Alyce, Anne, Elizabeth and Richard III.

He joined Monsanto Company in St. Louis in 1942 as a chemist, and progressed rapidly through a variety of supervisory positions, and in 1960 was named Director of Inorganic Research. In 1965, he was named Director of Management Information & Systems Department, and he became Assistant to President in 1967. In 1968, he became Manager, Electronic Enterprises; and in 1969, General Manager, Electronic Products Division, responsible for the development and marketing of electronic instruments in U.S. and abroad.

Two years later, he became

Vice President and Director, of the Mound Laboratory in Dayton, Ohio. In 1975, he was named Vice President of Monsanto Research Corporation, and became its President in 1976, responsible for all ongoing programs of both the Dayton Laboratories and the Miamisburg Mound facility. He retired from Monsanto in 1982.
